This springtime tour is specifically designed for first-timers although more experienced motorhomers are more than welcome. Visiting France, Belgium, The Netherlands and Luxembourg the route provides a rich and varied itinerary whilst still keeping the driving distances relatively low. Highlights include the cities of Bruges, Brussels, Maastricht, Luxembourg and Valkenburg. In Northern Luxembourg we drive across the largely un-spoilt rolling hills, forests and rivers of the Ardennes with time to visit the capital Luxembourg City, and the smaller monastery town of Clervaux. There is even time for a brief visit to France's Opal Coast.

ITINERARY:

NIGHT BEFORE: We stay on a campsite close to Dover where we provide a full briefing for the tour and advice on motorhoming on the continent in general. This is a complimentary night and you are welcome to join us at no additional cost.

DAYS 1 - 2: We head to Dover for our scheduled morning ferry crossing. We then have a short drive across to the world-heritage city of Bruges where we will spend two nights. Compact Bruges makes an excellent day-trip with its lively squares, network of narrow streets, canals and cafe culture.

DAYS 3 - 5 : We head into South Holland with our destination close to Maastricht. The city is a lively university town steeped in history dating back to Roman times. You can expect large squares, cobbled streets and fascinating architecture in amongst the cafes and restaurants. We also have a chance to visit Valkenburg, famed for its ruined castle and network of underground caves.

DAYS 6 - 7: We continue south deep into the Ardennes regions characterised by rolling forest, ridges and meandering rivers. We enter Luxembourg for the first time staying close to the pretty little town of Clervaux. Most famous for the monastery and castle that look over the town, this makes for an excellent and relaxing day trip.

DAYS 8 - 10: We stay in Luxembourg for the next three nights with our site close to the capital, Luxembourg City. The city itself has everything you would expect of a capital, just on a smaller scale. Located in a gorge and surrounded by ancient ruins and fortifications, the compact city is easy to navigate and boasts a lively cultural and artistic scene. It is also well-known for its fine-dining with no shortage of excellent restaurants. En route you have a chance to visit the fairy-tale castle at Vianden.

DAYS 11 - 12: We head into Belgium again today to the small town of Grimbergen, most famous for its beer. Our main reason for coming here though is to visit the nearby capital of Brussels. The highlight of the city is the stunning Grand Place and the network of restaurant-lined avenues that branch off from it. More unusual attractions include the bizarre Mannakin Pis and the space-age Atomium.

DAY 13: We start our journey back towards Calais with time for a brief visit to the Opal Coast of Northern France. There is no shortage of pretty little towns and villages stretched along the coastline here.

DAY 14: We head for the port and our scheduled afternoon crossing, or you may choose to extend your stay and take advantage of your flexible return ticket.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS/COSTS:

- There are toll charges on French motorways.
- We recommend a low emission zone sticker for France.
- Supplement of £75 per dog.
